Dear PSFCU Members.

We are on the eve of Christmas and the beginning of a new year. The holiday period is always a time for summarizing and reflection,



as well as a time for resolutions and creating plans for the future. The same is also happening at our Credit Union. We do not yet have the final financial results for 2023, but we can already say that it will be a record year in terms of income. We are pleased that this was another year of rapid growth in the number of our members. Our loan portfolio also grew in 2023, although the stagnant real estate market caused the growth to be lower than in previous years. Instead, we issued a record number of car loans, which are hugely popular among our members. In 2023, we opened two new branches. In September, the branch in Algonquin, IL was opened, and since the end of November, PSFCU's 23rd branch in New Britain CT has been in operation, established on the basis of the Mortgage Center already existing at the location. The launch of new branches, along with the continuous improvement of our technological infrastructure and expansion of our product ...continued on page 2

21st Presidential Economic Award Gala



For the 21st time, the President of the Republic of Poland honored businesses of key importance to the development of the national economy with the Economic Award. A special award from the hands of President Andrzej Duda was received by PSFCU Executive Director Bogdan Chmielewski.

The Gala of the 21st edition of the President's Economic Award took place on Thursday, November 23, 2023, at the Castle in Lancut. The President honored the winners in five general categories and two special categories. The purpose of this prestigious award is to support Polish companies and recognize the best ones, promoting a positive image of Poland and serving as a model for other companies and institutions.

Our Credit Union's Executive Director Bogdan Chmielewski, who was among the recipients of the Economic Award, stressed the importance of the honor for the Polish
